#### 1) Palouse Water Alternatives: Robin Nimmer

 PBAC History and 2020 Pumping Update: Nimmer recommended those that missed Steve Robischon's March PBAC presentation visit the PBAC website to view the recording.

Project Status: Nimmer provided a brief background on the water supply project, the
work Alta's team is doing, and the project status. This includes submitting a draft of
the Idaho water rights investigation, and an upcoming PBAC workshop on the interim
steps investigation.

## 2) Outreach: Ashley Ford

- Social Media: Ford described the work she's been doing with social media, provided metrics for social media, and requested the group follow and like PBAC on social media.
- PBAC Survey Questions: Ford discussed having a survey for the public and presented draft survey questions.
- 1-Pager: Ford presented some 1-pager options for handouts.

  - v. Climate change.
